PROPERTY TAX LEVY FOR FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES
SINGLE YEAR LEVY LID LIFT - PERMANENT

The Board of Kittitas County Fire Protection District No. 6 adopted Resolution No. 2015-9 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations. This proposition authorizes the District to increase its regular property tax levy from \$.55 to \$.80 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2016 and collected in 2017. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection and emergency medical services, replace apparatus, equipment and facilities and provide for firefighter safety.
