Safe Syringe Disposal



Sticker - Label an empty plastic bottle with the warning – BIOHAZARD using either a “pre-made” warning sticker, one that you make, or contact the Kittitas County Solid Waste Office for a Biohazard Sticker.

Store - Carefully put each of your used syringes into a plastic bottle.

Seal - Screw the cap back on tightly or put tape over the closed bottle cap when the bottle is full. Now your syringes are contained in a container that protects people from needle sticks and is unlikely to break open on its way to the landfill.

Safe Disposal - Dispose of the filled bottle by taking it to the Waste Management office, the County Transfer Station Tipping Floor, or the Kittitas County Solid Waste Office.

Businesses contact Waste Management for disposal
