**TO SEPA CHECKLIST SUPPLEMENTAL SHEET FOR NONPROJECT ACTIONS**

1. How would the proposal be likely to increase discharge to water; emissions to air; production, storage, or release of toxic or hazardous substances; or production of noise?

This is a Comprehensive Plan Docket request. The actual request will produce no discharge to water; emissions to air; production, storage, or release of toxic or hazardous substances; or production of noise. If the Docket request is granted, the new permitted use of a large/small animal crematory in the Commercial Agricultural Zone may result in discharge to water; emissions to air; production, storage, or release of toxic or hazardous substances; or production of noise.

Proposed measures to avoid or reduce such increases are:

The risks associated with discharges to water; emissions to air; production, storage, or release of toxic or hazardous substances; or production of noise can be minimized by requiring the use to follow best management practices and to meet all existing local, state, and federal regulations relating to or regulating discharges to water; emissions to air; production, storage, or release of toxic or hazardous substances; or production of noise.

6. How would the proposal be likely to increase demands on transportation or public services and utilities?

This is a Comprehensive Plan Docket request. If the Comprehensive Plan Docket change is made, then the actual use on a specific parcel may result in transportation impacts, depending on the type of facility.

Proposed measures to reduce or respond to such demand(s) are:
